
# AT SCHOOL WITH LA SCALA

The La Scala Academy provides thorough, in-depth training to the various professional figures involved in the performing arts through its four departments: Music, Dance, Stagecraft, Management. Its broad curriculum ranges from basic and core training courses to advanced courses, Level 1 and 2 AFAM (advanced training in art, music, and dance) university-level academic diploma programs, Level 1 master courses, workshops, and summer programs. The highest level of instruction is ensured by Teatro alla Scala professionals, acclaimed performers, and prominent experts in the performing arts. # THE COURSE

### COURSE COORDINATOR: PROFESSOR ANTONIO IAVAZZO

The First-Level Academic Diploma Course in Theatre Costumes provides a solid grounding in the history and culture of the performing arts—and opera in particular—and mastery of the methods and techniques for designing and creating costumes.


More specifically, it provides knowledge and methods of design and expression as well as competencies specific to the discipline/ profession of representing a character in theatre, television, cinema, advertising, fashion, and other applicable milieux.

Students will gain competency in the use of the tools, techniques, and materials of the trade, fully cognizant of the long tradition behind it and innovations introduced up to the present. They will also be encouraged to explore and experiment with the possibilities offered by this realm of expression in the visual arts.

Those completing the course will:

- have acquired solid cultural and technical training in theatre costumes, with an emphasis on the most advanced techniques and technologies;
- possess the necessary critical and methodological tools for further developing their competencies in the expressive languages of stage representation;
- be able to communicate effectively in a second EU language both in their main area of competency and on general topics;
- be familiar with information and communications technology (ICT) tools as they relate to their specific area of competency.

#### ATTENDANCE

Students must attend
at least 80% of overall
curricular activities and at
least two-thirds of each
individual subject, measured
in hours. Individual study
is excluded from this
requirement.



#### TOTAL HOURS

4.500 hours of classroom work, shop work, and individual study for a total of 180 credits. The program for each year involves 1,500 total hours and 60 credits.

# APPLICANT PROFILE



### SELECTION PROCESS

The course is open to a maximum of 20 participants. Applicants are admitted to the course after passing a selection process consisting of:

- a written test
- an interview
- (optional) assessment of a portfolio, garment, or accessory submitted by the candidate on the day of the written test and discussed during the interview

#### ♦ WHEN

The selection process will take place in two sessions: May 12–16, 2025 and September 22–25, 2025 (dates may be subject to change).

Those who enroll in and pass the first session will be eligible for a tuition discount. Those who do not pass the first session will have the option of enrolling in the second session but will lose the right to a tuition discount.

#### . ↓ WHERE

Both selection sessions will take place in Milan in the Academy facilities at Via Santa Marta 18.

The Academy is centrally located not far from Piazza Duomo and Teatro alla Scala. It is easily accessible from the metro stations Cordusio and Duomo (M1), Sant'Ambrogio (M2), and Missori and Duomo (M3).

Once you have arrived at the Academy you will find directions to the waiting room for the written test and the interview. Plan the trip so that you will have an ample time margin to arrive on time for your appointment.

#### ♦ STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Students with physical or learning disabilities who submit appropriate certification during the application process are entitled to compensatory measures (see Step 4 of Admission Process, below).

#### ♦ HOW

An email with the date and time of the selection process will be sent after the application deadline. The written test will last approximately 30 minutes and the interview will take approximately 20 minutes.

#### Written test

The written test consists of 30 closed-ended questions as follows:

- 10 questions on general culture related to art and performing arts;
- costumes, the study of materials, knowledge and use of the main basic hand and machine stitches, knowledge and use of the main basic tools necessary for tailoring techniques and the role and tasks of tailors in the performing arts. This is the starting point of the course in Theatre Costumes.

We recommend that you download the file "DISPENSA PER PARTECIPARE AL TEST" [File for test participation] from the Academy website (<a href="https://www.accademialascala.it/en/stagecraft/course-in-theatrical-tailoring">https://www.accademialascala.it/en/stagecraft/course-in-theatrical-tailoring</a>), which contains all necessary information for preparing for the test.

#### Interview

The interview assesses the candidate's motivations, aptitudes, and expectations. It should be seen as an opportunity to demonstrate your qualities and strengths. It will be structured as follows:

- a review of the written test;
- your educational background and any professional experiences or internships;
- what led you to choose this course of study and what your career interests are;
- your interest in theatre and the performing arts;
- your interest in musical theatre and costumes for the performing arts;
- discussion of your personal portfolio (if applicable).

#### ♦ WHAT TO BRING

A valid identity document.

You have the option of submitting a personal portfolio or a garment or accessory you have made at the time of the written test, and discussing it during the interview. The portfolio, garment, or accessory should be a means for demonstrating your experience in the performing arts..

Suggestions: ◆ Make sure you are able to clearly articulate why you want to study *Theatre Costumes* at the La Scala Academy ◆ Rehearse how you will illustrate your motivations and soft skills during the interview so you will be more effective and stimulating ◆ Research the history and activities of the La Scala Academy and Teatro alla Scala ◆ Do not be afraid to ask questions.

The Selection Committee will determine who is eligible for admission to the course, admitting the top candidates. If one or more of these candidates chooses not to attend the course, the next-ranked eligible candidate(s) may be admitted. The Examining Committee's decisions are final and incontestable. No explanations or justifications of its decisions will be provided.

# COSTS


The application fee (for participation in the selection process) is € 100 euros including VAT, which will be paid online when you apply. Payment may be made with principal credit/debit cards or by credit transfer via the MyBank circuit (the list of participating banks is provided at <a href="https://mybank.eu/participating-banks-and-psps/">https://mybank.eu/participating-banks-and-psps/</a>).

Tuition for the course is determined by the ISEE (equivalent financial status indicator) of the candidate's family as follows (all amounts include enrollment fee, curricular fee, and tuition):

ISEE € 0 - € 25,000 € 8,500

ISEE € 25.000 - € 50,000 **€ 9,500** 

ISEE > € 50,000 € 12,000



# TUITION AND FEES

Tuition and fees are paid via SDD (SEPA Direct Debit)\* in three installments\*\* and comprise the following:

Enrollment fee: €2,500

◆ Curricular fee: €700

Tuition: on the basis of candidate's ISEE

The ISEE to determine tuition must:

- be issued for the year that the course begins
- be valid for university study
- bear the student's codice fiscale\*

Candidates not submitting an ISEE will be assigned to the highest tuition bracket.

- \* Candidates who do not have a bank account in the Single Euro Payments Area (SEPA) and/or an Italian codice fiscale, please contact the teaching office (contact info under "MEET THE STAFF" below).
- \*\* Pursuant to Italian Legislative Decree no. 68 of March 29, 2012 (D.Lgs. 68/2012), a regional tax of €140 on university education is added to the first installment.

Tuition and fees for the first year are due as follows:



#### 1<sup>ST</sup> INSTALLMENT:



For those who pass the first session of the selection process: 50% of total annual tuition and fees plus the regional tax by June 30, 2025



For those admitted to the course in the second session of the selection process: 50% of total annual tuition and fees plus the regional tax by October 24, 2025



#### 2<sup>ND</sup> INSTALLMENT:

25% of overall annual tuition and fees by January 30, 2026

3 3RD INSTALLMENT:

25% of overall annual tuition and fees by April 30, 2026

You will apply for the selection process in a subsequent step.

You will be asked to accept the Academy privacy policy.

The Academy enrollment platform will guide you through the application process.



# ACCEPTANCE OF GENERAL CONTRACT CONDITIONS

The next step is to download and sign (either digitally or by printing and scanning) the "Condizioni di contratto per la partecipazione" [Contract conditions for participation (in the selection process)]. Upload the signed document where indicated. You must complete this step to continue the application process.



#### **ATTACHMENTS**

You will be asked to attach the following documents:

- ◆ The applicant's identity document (passport or identity card)
- The applicant's codice fiscale\*
- High school diploma or equivalent academic certification
- Certificate of physical or learning disability (if applicable)
- \* Contact the teaching office if you do not have an Italian codice fiscale (contact info under "MEET THE STAFF" below).



#### APPLICATION FEE

# COMPLETION OF PROCEDURE

Once the above steps have been completed, a summary will be generated of all information provided. You must print and sign this summary, scan it, and attach it where indicated. This completes the application for the selection process and all forms will be sent to the Academy Teaching Office [Segreteria Didattica]. Please follow all instructions on your screen or received via email from the

enrollment platform.

Make sure all the information you provide is correct. Any inaccuracies will result in automatic rejection of your application.

The Academy reserves the exclusive right to accept applications submitted after the above deadlines but before the beginning of the selection process.

The Academy also reserves the right to postpone the application timeframe, the selection process, and the beginning of the course.



#### **NOTIFICATIONS**

Candidates will be invited to the selection process by email after the application deadline.

Once the selection process has been completed, those admitted to the course will receive an email with instructions for enrolling in the course. ### INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS AND ITALIANS RESIDING ABROAD

Academic certification earned outside of Italy must be accompanied by a document certifying its legal validity pursuant to Italian law.

Specifically:

- ♦ If the academic certification has been obtained in a European Union member state, you must provide a sworn translation (traduzione asseverata) of the certification into Italian;
- ♦ If the academic certification has been obtained in a country outside of the European Union, you must provide a certificate of equivalence of qualification (dichiarazione di valore in loco).

International students and Italians residing abroad must also provide their CV in Italian or accompanied by an Italian translation.

Non-EU residents who are admitted to the course must complete the visa application process by registering on the platform <a href="www.universitaly.it">www.universitaly.it</a> and uploading all necessary documents.

# ACADEMIC CERTIFICATION

Students who acquire a total of 180 credits (per the study program) will receive a First-Level Academic Diploma recognized by the Italian Ministry of Universities and Research (MUR).
